In the past few decades fewer than half of the terrorist attacks are claimed.

Terrorists do not claim responsibility where too few are killed or too many killed, a kind of inverted U. If too few are killed then it is seen as an incompetent strike and if we too many are killed there is mass resentment.

Carrots originated in modern day day Iran and Afghanistan. Carrots used to be white and then turned orange.

Global suicide rates have dropped 29 % since 2000. America is an exception where suicide rates have risen 18 % since 2000.

In India and china suicide rates are higher amongst young women

Social change is partly responsible for falling suicide rates. Women have more freedom. Policy also plays a role, in USSR, Gorbachev put restrictions on alcohol and this reduced suicide rates.

The global average of suicides is 10 per 100,000 people. India and Japan are at 15, South Kore at 21 and Russia at 25. half of America suicide are firearms
